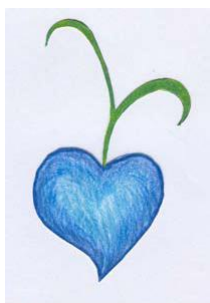

Attachment Focused Parenting

This Seminar offers support for parents and clinicians, empowering them with the knowledge and practical tools they need to develop healthier relationships for children. What to say, how to say it and why – theory, examples and practical interventions. This is a vital session for anyone involved in foster or adoptive care.

For the past 28 years Dan's professional training and experience has focused on the effects of abuse and neglect on childhood development, and especially on the development of anxious and disorganized attachment patterns. Relying heavily on the theory and research of attachment security, he has developed child and family psychotherapy interventions that serve to facilitate a child's ability to form secure attachments, following early years of abuse and neglect as well as parenting interventions that complement the treatment.

Dan's current passion is the training of therapists in the Dyadic Developmental Psychotherapy model. DDP is a directive, client-centered approach, influenced by psychodynamic, gestalt, Rogerian, and Ericksonian traditions, brought together within the dance of affect attunement that is seen most powerfully in the relationship between a parent and her/his infant and toddler. DDP has gradually become applied to less severe problems between parent and child as well as to marital and family relationships.

Dan is the author of three books, *Facilitating Developmental Attachment: The Road to Emotional Recovery and Behavioral Change in Foster and Adopted Children*, *Building the Bonds of Attachment: Awakening Love in Deeply Troubled Children*, *Attachment Focused Family Therapy and Attachment Focused Parenting*. His new clinical practice set of DVD's *Developing Attachment* also guides clinicians in the implementation of Dyadic Developmental Psychotherapy.

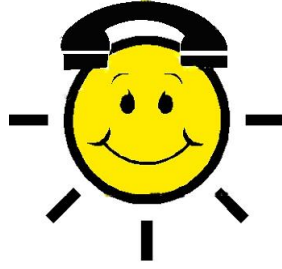

A Day with Dr. Dave Ziegler

Dave Ziegler, Ph.D., L.M.F.T., L.P.C., Licensed Psychologist, Executive Director and Organisation Founder of Jasper Mountain, Oregon USA, with a 37 year career as a therapist, clinical supervisor, foster parent and program manager. International authority and presenter on issues related to trauma and psychological treatment. Author of multiple books and publications including "Raising children who refuse to be raised", "Traumatic experience and the brain", "Beyond healing" and "Achieving Success with impossible children".

'The Science of Success in Working with Difficult Children'

The goal of this training is to take some of the most critically important findings of research and translate them into understandable and useful approaches to our work. Participants will leave with new tools to immediately put into practice. This training is for everyone from the beginner to the expert: for Protective Workers, Case Managers, Team Leaders, Residential Workers, Foster, Kinship and Permanent Carers, Teachers and Teacher's Aides. The seminar will address complex issues and present practical applications creating a broader understanding of the psychological, physical and spiritual needs of children who have experienced trauma and broken attachments.

Topics to be covered

- Facilitating Perceptual Change—how to help children adjust what they experience to change the world they live in.
- The essential function of Neuro-integration—step by step methods to help parts of the brain work together.
- Changing the Brain's Information
- Processing System—how to turn part of the brain off and turn other parts on to promote higher order reasoning.
- Activating the Orbitofrontal Cortex—making sure that someone is in the brain's driver's seat otherwise the individual will crash.
- Neuro-template Development—how to change the brain in positive directions.

Learning Objectives

- Define traumatic experiences that affect the human brain.
- Identify the three primary impacts of chronic traumatic experiences: Perceptual impairment, Limbic activation, Attachment disturbance.
- Understand the importance of attachment to life long success.
- Improve the outcomes when working with challenging clients.
- Develop a working knowledge of the brain's most important regions involved in successfully working with children.

- Nancy Newton Verrier (2009), *The Primal Wound: Understanding the adopted child*'.

BAAF is pleased to announce the new UK edition of Nancy Verrier's adoption classic *The Primal Wound*. Since its original publication in 1993 this book has come to be considered the adoptees' bible and a "must read" for adopted people, adoptive families, birth parents and adoption professionals.

The Primal Wound has revolutionised how we think about adoption. In it Nancy Verrier elaborates on what she calls the "primal wound" – the wound that results when a child is separated from his or her mother – and the trauma that it causes. She examines the life-long consequences this can have for adopted people, as they are growing up and into adulthood, underpinning this with information about pre- and perinatal psychology, attachment, bonding, and the effects of loss.

The Primal Wound offers adopted people validation for their feelings, explanations for their behaviour, and a context in which to situate and make sense of their experiences. It is a must for anyone struggling with unexplained feelings and insecurities caused by adoption, and has been described as "life changing", "a light bulb experience", "a revelation" and "a journey of discovery".
